# Fourth Japan-EU English Haiku Contest -Winners will be invited to Japan or Belgium-(Guidelines for Submission)

### Introduction

Mr Herman Van Rompuy, President of the European Council, is a haiku poet who has published his own book of haiku poetry. To advance "People-to-people and cultural exchanges," a common Japan-EU goal, the Japan-EU English Haiku Contest has been held three times previously. The third contest was held from June to July 2012 under the theme of "Dawn," and 523 haiku poets participated in the competition.

This year, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Japan and the European Union are pleased to host the Fourth Japan-EU English Haiku Contest and call on contestants to share their haiku under the theme of "Rainbow", hoping this contest will also deepen the relationship between Japan and the EU at the grass-root level.

- Organizers: Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Japan (MOFA), Delegation of the European Union to Japan
- **Sponsors**: Matsuyama City (Ehime Prefecture, Japan), Flemish Haiku Center (Belgium)
- Theme: Rainbow
- Rules of entry: Only one English haiku, previously unpublished, may be submitted per applicant. Please refer to some aspect of the theme "Rainbow." Since haiku is considered to be the shortest poem in the world, three-line haiku is desirable. Seasonal words (Kigo) are not essential for the entries.
- Eligibility for participation: The contest is open to the nationals of the EU member states (including Croatia; the same will apply hereinafter) and Japan who are currently residing in the EU or Japan. This is available to all ages.
